Possible Threat to the Community
“Your Right to Know”

January 13, 2024

Type of Report: Sexual Assault Offense
Incident number: 2024-0017

Reported offense:

A sexual assault (fondling) offense was reported to MSUM Public Safety on January 13, 2024, at approximately 12:32 a.m. The reported assault occurred on January 12, 2024, at approximately 10:30 p.m. in South Snarr Hall. The victim, who is a MSUM student, reported an individual (who is known to the victim) sexually assaulted them.

Remember:

- Perpetrators are responsible for sexual assaults. Perpetrators take advantage of vulnerability and seek opportunities to commit sexual assaults.
- Trust your instincts. If you feel unsafe, get to a safe place, and call for help.
- Get verbal consent from your partner, and don't assume you know what the other person wants.
- Consent can be withdrawn at any time.
- Don't feel obligated to do anything you don't want to. “I don't want to” is always a good enough reason.
